

# Valentine

## Materials Required:

Red silky fabric 6cm x 7cm.

Bondaweb 6cm x 7cm.

Fine Gold cord 17cm approx.

Quilling tool.

2mm Quilling paper: Pale Green, Olive Green and Pale Yellow with a Gold edge.

Scraps of White shiny/textured card.

Tracing paper and pencil.

Hole punch.

Gold Label stickers: Gold Valentine, XL140U-01 and Gold border, XL051U-01.

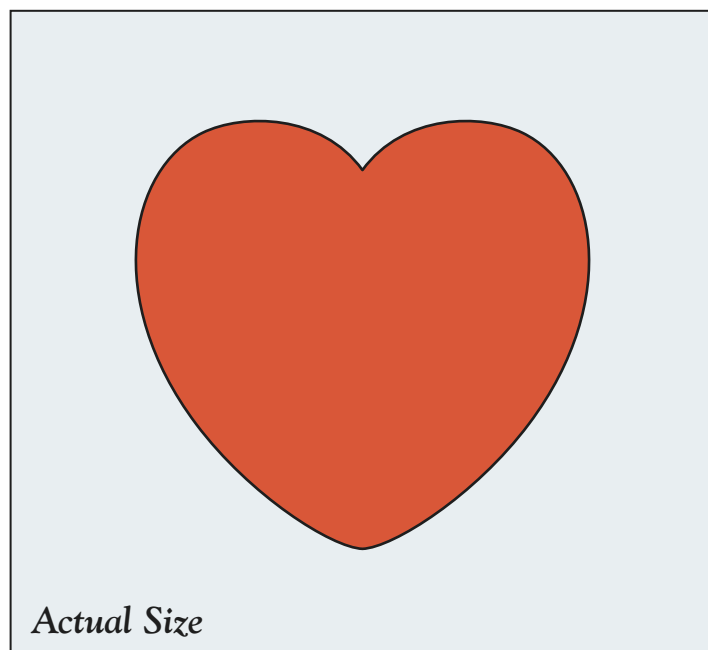
P.V.A. Craft adhesive.

Card mount SF03M-82, Silver.

## To Make The Card:

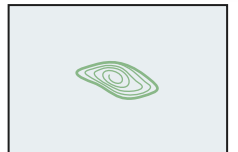
Fix the bondaweb onto the red fabric following the instructions on the pack.

Trace the heart shape onto tracing paper and cut it out. Pin the traced heart onto the fabric and carefully cut around the traced pattern. Place the heart into position on the card with the fabric side up, cover with a cloth and iron over to stick the heart directly onto the card.



## Leaves:

Make 8 in pale green and 4 in olive green. Roll a  $\frac{1}{4}$  length of paper into a coil, remove from the tool and allow to loosen before gluing the end. Pinch the coil at opposite ends to shape.

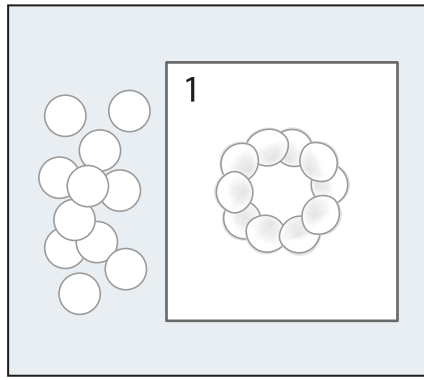


## Flowers:

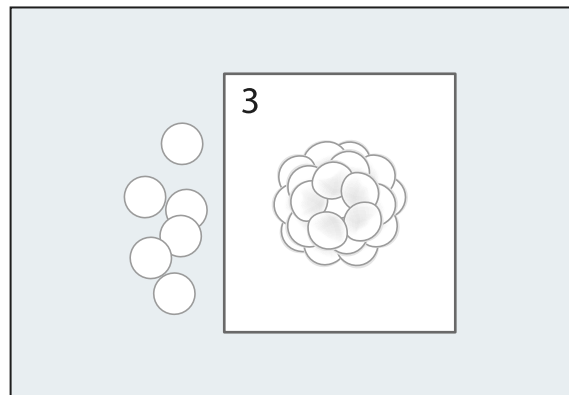
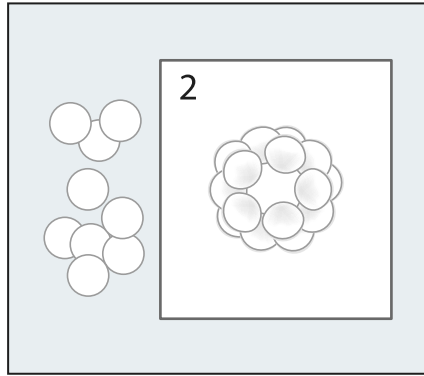
Make 3 in different sizes. Use a shiny card for the petals, possibly with a bit of texture as well to give the flowers a patterned finish. Try Stardream quartz or Hi-5 white for a shiny finish, Constellation pearl in satin or shantung will add texture as well as shine.

Punch out some dots in your chosen card. Roll a tight peg of pale yellow/gold paper using approx.  $\frac{1}{3}$  of a length and glue the end to prevent it unrolling.

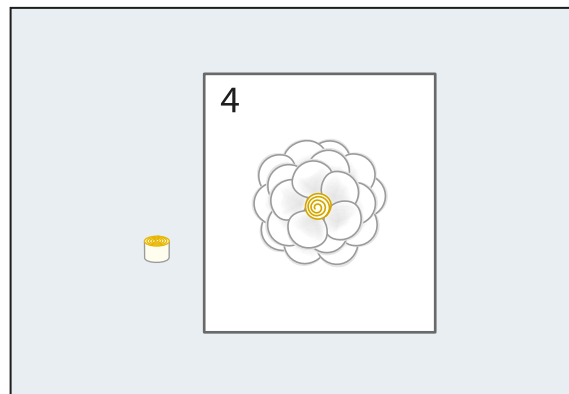
1. Glue a circle of 10 dots onto a scrap of clean paper overlapping them as shown. Glue the dots onto the paper by the inner edge only, leaving the outer edge free.



2. Make a smaller circle inside the first using less dots and placing them so they almost touch each other, rather than overlapping.



3. Make a third, smaller circle inside the last, these petals will need to overlap each other as shown.



4. Glue the peg into the gap in the centre of the flower with the gold edge uppermost. Once the glue has dried, tear away the excess scrap paper from around the flower.

Make the other two flowers, one starting with a ring of 11 dots and the

other with just 9. Work the inner rings with enough dots to give the flowers a natural look.

Using the assembly diagram, position and glue the flowers onto the card. Place the leaves as shown, tucking them under the flower petals where required. To make the curled tendrils use pale green paper for two of them and olive green for the other two. Wind one end of the strip 4 or 5 times round on the tool and release. Cut to length and glue into place.

For the border, cut four strips of hearts to length. Two at 12 hearts long and two at 17. When applying the stickers to the card, the outer points of the hearts (shown by the grey lines on the diagram), should be placed 3mm from each side edge and 6mm from the top and bottom edges. On Stardream card you can easily get away with peeling the strip off and re-positioning it a couple of times if needed. Add the wording stickers into the space left.
